

How can I get a flat at Old Church Court?

You will need to be referred by Enfield Social Services. You will need to have a learning disability and be able to live in your own flat with support.

When a flat becomes available in Old Church Court, you will be invited to have a look round the building.

You can talk to staff there to see if the service is right for you. If you like what you see, you can make an application.

If your application is successful, SPH Housing staff will support you to move in and get settled.

SPH Housing provides supported housing for people with learning disabilities at Old Church Court in Enfield. It is about learning to live independently.

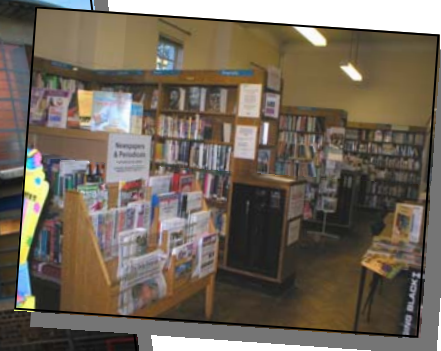
The flats at Old Church Court

What support will I get?



You will receive support from professional and friendly SPH Housing staff who are based in the building.



You have a say in the service we provide and what kind of support you get.

This is called person-centred planning.

For example, we will support you with:

- *Support with claiming housing benefit, grants and DSS benefits*
- *Support around settling into your new home*
- *Emotional support*
- *Referrals to borough-wide community support services*
- *Liaison with teams within Social Services*
- *Support with maintaining links with family, friends and other support services*
- *Support with independent living skills*



The time and venue of meetings are arranged to meet your needs.
